book'ing office, 1. an office where passage or travel tickets are sold. [Obs.]

2. an office where passengers are registered and conveyed by train.

book'ish, *a.* 1. concerned with books.

2. inclined to be pedantic or pedant.

3. having book learning; erudite.

4. pedantic; characterized by formality of expression; as, a bookish manner of speech.

book'ish-ly, *adv.* in a bookish manner.

book'ish-ness, *n.* attachment to books; fondness for study; quality of being bookish.

book jack'et, a detachable cover of paper, etc., for protecting the binding of a book, usually with colored illustrations and designs for advertising or calling attention to the book.

book'keep'kr, *n.* a person whose profession is bookkeeping.

book'keep'ing, *n.* the art or profession of recording business transactions in a regular, systematic manner.

There are two systems of bookkeeping in common use, known as the single entry and double entry. In single entry bookkeeping, the record of each transaction is kept on either the debit or the credit side of an account. In double entry, two entries of every transaction are made and made on both sides, one balancing and checking the other.

book house, one of the wingless insects that deposit their eggs in botanical collections; psyllid.

book mad'ness, a mania for books; bibliomania.

2. a person in the habit of betting on race horses.

nurse maid (nürs'mäid), *n.* a girl who is hired to take care of a child or children.

nurs-er-y (nür'ser-i), *n.* 1. a place aside for the special use of children or infants. 2. a nursery school. 3. a place where young trees or plants are raised for study or sale. — **nurs'-er-ies**, *pl.*

nurs-er-y-man (nür'ser-i-man), *n.* a person who owns or works in a nursery for growing trees, plants, etc. — **nurs'-er-y-men**, *pl.*

nurs-ery rhyme, a short poem for young children.

nurs-ery school, a school for children who are too young for kindergarten.

nur-sure (nür'shar), *n.* 1. the training, care, or bringing up, as of a child. 2. anything that nourishes; food. — *v.* 1. to bring up with care; help grow or develop; train. 2. to feed or nourish. — **nur-sured**, *p.t. & p.p.*; **nur-sur-ing**, *pr.p.*

nut (nut), *n.* 1. a dry fruit that has a hard shell and a kernel inside that is often eaten. 2. the kernel of a fruit. 3. a small metal piece that is screwed into a hole to hold it in place. 4. a person who is silly or crazy [He's a nut].

nut-crack (nut'krak), *n.* a tool used to crack the shells of nuts.

nut-hatch (nut'hatch), *n.* a small bird that has a sharp beak and feeds on nuts, etc.

o (o), *n.* the eighteenth letter of the English alphabet. — **o's**, *pl.*

oaf (of), *n.* a stupid person. — **oaf-ish**, *adj.*

O-a-hu (o'a-hu), *n.* the name of the island of Honolulu is on this island.

oat (nut'met), *n.* the kernel of a nut.

oat-meg (oat'meg), *n.* the name of a tropical tree. It is used as a spice.

nu-tri-a (nöö'tri-a), *n.* 1. a American animal what like the beaver.

nu-trient (nöö'tri-ent), *n.* something that is nourishing. — *n.*

nu-tri-tion (nöö'tri-shun), *n.* the process by which an animal or plant takes in food and uses it in living and growing.

nu-tri-tious (nöö'tri-shus or nöö'tri-shus), *adj.* food; nourishment. — **nu-tri-tion-al**, *adj.*
